There are a number of people in our neighbourhoods and towns across Moray who unfortunately have no family or friends living close by who can act as their alarm responder to check on them to provide initial support and re-assurance.

We are in need of more volunteers to act as a named contact for someone in their local community.

Being a responder does not mean you are on call 24/7 - we only ask that you respond if you are available, and volunteers provide no medical assistance. All volunteers with our team receive excellent support and training. Get in touch to have a chat to find out more.

Fundraising Crew


Moray (based Buckie Station)

Speyside Youth

The charity's aim is to advance the citizenship of young people primarily those living within the Moray community boundaries of Speyside and Dufftown and District, through a structured programme of support, opportunity and activity provided by our team of Youth Workers.

Our vision is to provide opportunities for the young people, help them to develop life skills and empower them to make a difference in the community.

We are very much a youth led organisation with our youth committee being supported and mentored by our Advisory Group & Trustees. We have monthly Advisory Group/Trustee meetings (usually on a Monday evening), for approx 2 hours, in Dufftown Community Centre.

We currently have 5 Trustees however we are looking for 2 or 3 new members who can bring fresh, new ideas to our group and help ensure we can continue to offer this valuable project to the young people of Speyside.



Shopmobility Moray

Since 1995, Shopmobility Moray has been assisting people with low-cost rental of mobility aids, wheelchairs and scooters. Not only to do they provide this for shoppers, but also for people who need longer terms loans. This year, requests for equipment have increased. They are looking for one or two new trustees with financial skill, business planning, fundraising and/or marketing to join their board, to help take the charity forward at a point of change.



Transition Town Forres

Transition Town Forres is part of an international movement helping to build more localised economies. They have a flourishing community garden, centre and kitchen, and host regular events that support a circular economy, including a repair cafe. They would welcome one or two new trustees with financial and accounting acumen, perhaps for the role of treasurer, but also trustees who have skill in grant and fundraising experience.

REAP

REAP is an independent local charity based in Keith, founded in 1997 and operating throughout Moray. REAP has done various types of community and environmental work over the last 20+ years but our focus has always been on helping individuals and communities find solutions.

At the moment we have two broad strands of work:

Food and Growing – helping people grow and eat more of their own food, compost more, take part in therapeutic gardening and environmental improvement, get outside more and cut their carbon footprint.

Energy saving advice – helping people with switching tariffs, cutting their bills through energy-saving behaviours, advising on availability of grants and loans, training volunteers to be energy champions who can support their friends and neighbours to save energy and save money and working to promote community-led social and environmental projects.

We welcome volunteer directors to join our staff team and current Board who are keen to help REAP make a difference in our local communities. Pushing up the Daisies

Pushing up the Daisies is a pioneering Scotland-wide charity. Our aim is for everyone in Scotland to know their practical options and legal rights immediately after someone dies and to be able to spend time with them in the place of their choice if that is their wish.

Since our inception in 2016, we have offered an advice line and well-received, inspiring and informative education to hospice staff, end-of-life companions, celebrants and the general public. The charity's Daisy Chain of volunteers around Scotland helps people consider all their options and how best to look after themselves, including the option to keep someone in the privacy and comfort of home after their last breath.

Since November 2021 we have provided a service in the Moray area (afterthelastbreath.scot) to practically assist people who want to take charge of someone in the days after their last breath and be involved in the arrangements for their burial or cremation. This is aimed to be instead of or alongside funeral directors. We want to develop this aspect of the charity as a valued service and also as a source of income to support our educational activities.

We are now in a position to expand the Board of Trustees to strengthen and expand the charity and particularly to develop the service aspect of the charity in a business-like way.

The current charity trustees are passionate about the work of the charity. We want to balance this with supportive business expertise. We are also looking to balance people with the inspiration and time to be hands-on in our development and people experienced to take an overview in the development and governance.

Role

The main duties of a Trustee are to participate in Board meetings, currently quarterly (preferably in Moray, but could be online), act as an advocate for our work, and be responsible for governance of the charity. Some trustees also participate in the day to day management of the charity, mainly by email.
