Cats Protection

Lifeline Foster Volunteer

Cats Protection offer a free and confidential fostering service for cats whose families are fleeing domestic abuse so they can rest assured their cat will be taken care of until they can be safely reunited. They'll cover all costs so all you need to do is provide a loving home for your foster cat and send lots of photos so they can give their owner updates. Fostering with this service is completely confidential, so you won't actually know anything about the owner and they also won't know your identity either. All communication goes through the dedicated Lifeline team to maintain anonymity.

They need help at events such as Tesco collections and Highland Games where you will be manning a table for just 2 hours with another volunteer.

CrossReach

Volunteer Counsellor

As a volunteer counsellor with CrossReach, you will be providing a professional counselling service to clients. They will provide you with the necessary training that allows you to practice within their guidelines. They will also offer you the necessary training needed when you join the team.

If you would like to volunteer with them as a counsellor, they ask that you have completed a diploma in counselling or are currently undergoing a counselling diploma and have completed your readiness to practice. For their perinatal services they also ask that you have completed a minimum of 50 clinical hours. If you would like to see clients online, they ask that you have completed an ACTO approved online training course. They will discuss at interview the number of clients you will see, along with the number of clinical hours that you can volunteer for.

Once you have passed your interview stage, they will apply for a PVG Membership for you, whether this be a new membership or an update to an existing membership.
