Group Support Volunteers

As a group support volunteer, you would volunteer alongside another member/s of the team to assist with group activities including arts, crafts, cooking, sports, music which can help to improve the health and wellbeing of young people.

You would look to introduce young people to new activities to help them learn new skills and develop new interests. Group support volunteers can volunteer from age 18 and over and don't have to have previous experience of volunteering or working with young people. For our groups having a volunteer can make such a positive impact on their lives and help change their future. Through groups you can develop confidence and self-belief to achieve life goals.

As a volunteer you will gain practical experience of spending time with children and young people and increase your knowledge about the issues affecting young people. You will meet a range of new people and be filled with a sense of satisfaction, knowing that you have helped make a difference in a child or young persons life. Volunteers can spend their time on a weekly basis and days/evenings and times can be flexible, with a minimum commitment of 6 months. Excellent support provided to all volunteers. Expenses are paid monthly. You will receive mandatory training at Aberlour YouthPoint and be offered any other relevant training and will have regular contact with the volunteer co-ordinator.

Young Person's Mentor

As a volunteer mentor you will be matched with a young person who you would spend regular time on a 1:1 basis, working towards building a trusting relationship. Right now, mentoring is also available online, so if volunteers prefer and feel they are better suited to offer online support, they can. Volunteers who mentor in person also take part in activities that is of interest to your young person, such as cooking, sports, and crafts. You can also introduce them to new activities to help them learn new skills and develop new interests.

Through having a mentor, a young person can develop confidence and self-belief to achieve their life goals. As a volunteer you will gain practical experience of spending time with children and increase your knowledge about the issues affecting young people. You will meet a range of new people and be filled with a sense of satisfaction, knowing that you have helped make a difference in a child's life.

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Moray Committee Secretary (Meetings 4x per year) Moray



The Moray Duke of Edinburgh Awards committee is a local charity that supports the DofE awards in Moray. Currently, they are looking for a person to help by joining their team as a committee secretary. Key tasks are working with the Chairperson to prepare agendas, send out invitations and prepare minutes for committee meetings. In line with the committee's constitution, there are four meetings per year.







The Secretary will volunteer alongside the Chair to plan the quarterly meetings. At these meetings, the committee will discuss committee business and any request for funding from the DofE centres and volunteers working with DofE Moray.

As Secretary, you will need good literacy, IT skills, organisational skills and the ability to work on your own initiative. Previous experience of working in a committee is desirable.

Volunteers will receive introduction training in the ethos of the award, how it operates and the benefits that young people get from taking part in the award. This training includes an e-learning package and a briefing from one of the councils DofE Moray Team. The Chair of the committee will brief the new secretary on how the committee works and there will be ongoing support from the Chair and the DofE Moray Team.

Clan Cancer Support is the largest, independent cancer support charity in the north of Scotland and helps around 2,500 people affected by a cancer diagnosis every year. Clan services are freely offered across north-east Scotland, Moray, Orkney and Shetland and are available from pre-diagnosis and diagnosis through treatment and beyond. They provide professional counselling, complementary therapies, nutrition and wellbeing activities, information and dedicated support for children and families.

Right now, Clan has a number of volunteering positions across the Moray region, and anyone with a positive "can do" attitude who is passionate about helping people affected by cancer in their local area is an ideal candidate.

Clan are looking for **Listening and Support Volunteers** to provide emotional support to people affected by a cancer diagnosis. These positions are available in their Elgin, Lossiemouth and Forres locations.

This role would suit you if you have good listening and communication skills, a warm and friendly manner and the ability to maintain discretion and confidentiality.

They are also looking for **Volunteer Drivers** in Moray. These volunteers support their vital transportation service across the north-east and Moray for clients attending Aberdeen, Raigmore and Dr Grays hospitals for cancer treatment. In this role you'll be able to use you driving experience and develop your listening and support skills.

Finally, Clan are looking for **Event Volunteers** in Moray. From manning the cheering points on runs, walks or cycles, to welcoming guests at annual lunches or balls, or providing information at open days – you'll raise awareness of the great work Clan does.

Ideally volunteers can spare around three hours per week, from a range of backgrounds, age groups and skill sets.
